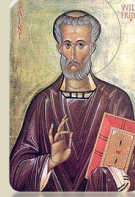

- If you have any suitable books with which you have finished and feel someone else may enjoy reading please donate them to the library by placing them in the 'donated books' box

Memorial Mass - Remembering those who died since the Pandemic began

Since the Pandemic began, the ways in which we have been able to say goodbye to our loved ones and to celebrate their funerals have been severely restricted. This applies to those who died with the Coronavirus and to those we have lost through other circumstances. Every family and parish is finding ways to express their loss. As part of our Diocesan family approach to these difficult times we shall especially dedicate the month of November to our remembrance.

For November, every parish is invited to prepare a 'Book of Remembrance' to contain the names of all those who died during these difficult days. Each parish is asked to celebrate a special Mass for their dead using the Book of Remembrance as a focus. **St Joseph's parish Memorial Mass** will be at **12.05pm Tuesday 16th November** and **St Wilfrid's parish Memorial Mass** will be at **10.00am Monday 15th November**

Each Episcopal Area will have an opportunity to gather for another Mass for our Dead at which Bishop Robert plans to preside. Our Episcopal Area Mass will be announced soon.

These Books of Remembrance will then be brought to Saint Mary's Cathedral, Newcastle the following week, so that all those named may be remembered at a Solemn Requiem Mass celebrated by Bishop Robert at 11.00am on Saturday 27th November. Representation from the parishes will be invited to this Mass while respecting the ongoing need for distancing.

Synod
